# Walls Are Tumbling Down A cantata as musical protest

#### Public dress rehearsal

On 10 February 2025, Dresden will be the centre of a very special artistic event: Eunice Martins and Ibrahim Quraishi will make a powerful statement against exclusion, hatred and prejudice with their intercultural cantata Walls Are Tumbling Down. Inspired by the story of the fall of Jericho, shofars, percussion, electronics, vocals and rebellious sounds merge into a powerful message - a passionate call for solidarity, resistance and change.

Since June 2024, Martins and Quraishi have been working not only to assemble a temporary ensemble of over 20 musicians, but also to compose the cantata through a participatory process. The majority of this ensemble is made up of artists living in Dresden. Jewish, Muslim, Arab, Afro-German and native Saxon voices combine with narratives in Hebrew, Arabic, Yiddish and German. This unique work sends a clear signal against anti-Semitism, Islamophobia and racism.

The rehearsals took place in highly symbolic locations that reflect the challenges faced by marginalised groups in Germany. The general rehearsal will be presented as part of the Staatsschauspiel Dresden's MontagsCafé - a transcultural meeting place where migration and culture can be experienced as living processes. Here the cantata becomes a dialogue about social cohesion and a celebration of what unites us.

During rehearsals, the music caused the Carola Bridge to collapse. Like the walls of Jericho, the bridge fell as if in response to the power of the sounds. Is it a warning? Perhaps. But one thing is certain: the cantata calls for the demolition of false bridges - bridges that support intolerance, hatred and injustice. The collapse is a reminder that it is time to build new, better bridges that promote understanding and solidarity. The bridge may have fallen, but the message remains: Together we can bring down walls and connect the world.


